SERTIH IS THERE TO HELP

In Québec, it is possible to provide health care services or to pursue training in this field, while being a blood-borne infection carrier, such as human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), hepatitis C virus (HCV) or hepatitis B virus (HBV).

WHAT IS SERTIH?

The Blood-Borne Infection Risk Assessment Unit (Service d'évaluation des risques de transmission d'infections hématogènes – SERTIH) of the Institut national de santé publique du Québec is intended for healthcare professionals and students in the province of Québec who are blood-borne infection carriers and who perform **exposure-prone procedures.**

The service allows concerned professionals to get a **risk assessment** of infection transmission to their patients.

A procedure is considered to be an exposure-prone procedure when the caregiver:

- uses a sharp object;
- has their hands in a confined cavity in the body of a person receiving care;
- cannot see their hands and could cut themself without realizing it.

The caregiver's blood could then come into contact with the blood or mucous membranes of the person receiving care.

Who is eligible for the service?

Professions and training programs that include exposureprone procedures are:

- Medecine
- Dental medecine
- Dental hygiene
- Midwifery

- Nursing and auxiliary nursing care
- Surgical podiatry
- Pre-hospital emergency care (paramedics)

ARE YOU AWARE OF YOUR HEALTH STATUS?

If in doubt, do not take any risk. Get yourself screened for blood-borne infections, and if one or more of your tests are positive, contact rapidly your doctor and SERTIH.
